Tim Zajontz is a lecturer at the Chair for International Politics at the Technische Universität Dresden, Germany. He is also a research fellow in our department's Centre for International and Comparative Politics and a research associate in the Second Cold War Observatory, a global collective of scholars committed to understanding how great power rivalry will influence societies, economies, and ecologies worldwide. Tim holds a PhD from the University of St Andrews where he worked under the supervision of the late Prof. Ian Taylor on the political economy and governance of Chinese-funded infrastructure in Tanzania and Zambia. Before entering academia, Tim worked in various advisory positions in German and EU politics. He is a Stellenbosch alumnus who graduated in 2013 with an MA in International Studies.
