Ph.D. finished at Northwest University in July 2023, will join The University of Chicago in September as a Collegiate Assistant Professor in the Social division, Harper-Schmidt Fellow



Bio: Ph.D. in Political Science, Northwestern University, USA. Collegiate Assistant Professor in the Social Sciences Division, the University of Chicago and Harper-Schmidt Fellow in the Society of Fellows in the Liberal Arts. Studies comparative politics, institutions, and development, with a particular focus on political change, settler colonialism, and postcolonial development in Africa in general and in Southern Africa in particular. In his book project based on his dissertation, he develop a comparative-historical explanation of the causes and development of markedly differing legacies of liberation (i.e., patterns of democratic inclusion, structural inequalities, and national polarization) in Mozambique and Angola, Zimbabwe, and South Africa and Namibia. He shows how and why dramatically contrasting reform choices adopted by national liberation elites during the critical juncture of liberation reforms led to path-dependent trajectories of political development in Southern Africa.
