Omomayowa is a final-year doctoral student in the Department of Political Science at Stellenbosch University, South Africa. He previously completed a BSc (Hons) in Politics, Philosophy and Economics (PPE) and an MSc in Political Science at Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile-Ife, Nigeria. His doctoral research explores young politicians at the intersection of party and legislative politics to understand how they navigate the dynamics of intra-party politics as party aspirants and candidates. In the same vein, the research examines the legislative effectiveness of young parliamentarians in Nigeria's national and subnational legislatures. He recently completed a one-year fellowship in the School of Politics and International Studies (POLIS) at the University of Leeds, United Kingdom. Previously, he worked as an Assisting Lecturer in the Department of Political Science and International Relations at King's University, Odeomu, Nigeria. His research interests revolve around party and legislative politics as well as digital and urban governance in Africa. His research has been published in international journals like the *Journal of Legislative Studies*, *Journal of Public Affairs*, and *International Journal of Public Administration*.
